## 9-16 & 17-24 Electric Mansions, ELECTRIC AVENUE, SW9 – Proposed gates to porches:

Dear Miss Shallcross,

Thank you for your recent letter about the above application. This is a prominent site within Brixton Town Centre, and the Society's comments are as follows:

## Conflict with late-night uses:

The Society has long supported the refurbishment of Electric Avenue, including the retention or restoration of flats above the shopping frontage.

However, the Council's failure to control over-night activities in the Town Centre has resulted in a very difficult living environment, due to noise, litter and anti-social behaviour, including use of the highway as a public toilet. While we would prefer more active enforcement measures to minimise anti-social behaviour, the proposed gates will provide some relief to residents, and so are welcomed.

## **Detail Design:**

We commend the quality of the earlier restoration work on these two porches. The proposed gate designs appear to be in keeping with the original.
